Welcome to the start of what promises to be a very busy Autumn Term. We were delighted to see so many of you at our Welcome Meetings.

Parking

We have had several complaints about parking already this term. We are keen to be good neighbours to the families that live around us and most importantly to ensure that our children are safe during their journey to and from school. Homework

We are trialling a new way of providing homework. The new method is very much in line with most Primary Schools now and we hope that it will provide parents with an opportunity to do as much or as little work in addition to the school day as they wish.

Knowledge organisers will be sent home for each class soon via Class Dojo. It will detail for you exactly what is being taught in each class for each subject. Parents can use the knowledge organisers to discuss and investigate the terms learning with their child alongside the work that is provided by class teachers which includes reading, spelling, and times tables.

An electronic survey will be sent out at the end of the half term to gather your views.

Trim Trail

Unfortunately, the company we use to maintain our trim trail and assess it annually for safety, feels unable to issue a certificate this year due to several splits in the upright logs. The trim trail is over twenty years old and the average lifespan is approx. 10 years. This means that the trail will have to be removed. Ropsley Rascals After School Club

Ropsley Rascals is open during the school's term times, 5 afternoons a week, Monday to Friday from 15:30pm until 18:00pm (15:15pm for Reception Children).

Ropsley Rascals

3:15pm until 4:30pm = £5.00 4.30pm until 5.30pm =£3.00 Tea @ 4.45pm = £2.00 5.30pm -6.00pm = £1.00

If a parent chooses to send a child to Rascals for the whole evening and they have tea the cost will be each of the slots added together and tea – so £11:00.

You can book a place at either Breakfast Club or Rascals via Parentmail and this is our preferred way of ensuring you get a place.

There have been several mornings just recently when Breakfast Club has been very close to its maximum numbers. If this happens and you have not booked a place staff will unfortunately have to turn children away.

If we discover more children than our maximum numbers wish to have a place we can arrange for extra staffing to be in place but this relies on us knowing in advance.
